

In 2017 BNT LED, EMPOWERED and CHANGED Bridgeport neighborhoods by working with residents to innovatively create sustainable communities through affordable housing and commercial opportunities. BNT is a community builder and nonprofit developer with a social purpose and a passion for helping others. BNT builds housing people can afford in neighborhoods where families want to live and raise their children. Specifically, Bridgeport Neighborhood Trust is a purpose-driven development company focused on stabilizing three Bridgeport neighborhoods, Downtown West, the South End, and the East End, by working alongside neighborhood residents to identify each community's priorities and providing housing solutions tailored to meet their unique needs.



2017 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

THIS YEAR BNT HAS...

- Served 2,119 clients, offered 152 classes in pre-purchase education, foreclosure prevention, credit coaching, landlord tenant education and financial literacy.
- Helped 390 households achieve homeownership and close on \$86,228,001 in mortgages.
- Worked with 88 families to avoid foreclosure and saved \$15,300,000 in mortgages.
- Developed a real estate pipeline of almost 200 housing units and 50,000 sq. ft. of commercial space representing \$40,000,000 of potential investment in Bridgeport.
- Managed \$40,000,000 portfolio of 208 housing units and 18,000 sq. ft. of commercial space paying \$450,000 in local real estate taxes. These spaces are home to more than 400 individuals and families.
- Created 54 units of housing, leveraging \$13,000,000 in public and private financing, creating more than 100 temporary construction jobs.

To do so, BNT employed 23 full-time staff and was led by an 11 member Board of Directors, all of whom are among the most talented and dedicated people in the community development industry.

There is nothing more important than having a stable income that allows you to provide for your family. To that end BNT is committed to developing social enterprises. As BNT moves into 2018 that will take many forms, in 2017 it started with BuildBNT. BuildBNT is the first social enterprise at BNT; a construction and renovation company. That company allows BNT to self-perform renovation activities in its smaller multi-family developments while reducing expenses. BuildBNT completed its first project with the renovation of 1534 Seaview Avenue, a small mixed-use development. In an effort to find young qualified local workers, BuildBNT partnered with YouthBuild, a division of The Workplace designed to help local youth learn job skills and serve the community. So far BuildBNT has hosted seven interns and hired two program participants. Also, 1534 Seaview Avenue now houses four young families with children.

Guided by BNT'S Empowerment Resource Academy staff, Adrian Cunningham and Annakay Young's dream of owning their own home became a reality. The couple moved into a home of their own in September of 2017. Born and raised in Jamaica, Adrian came to America in hopes of a better life. After meeting Annakay and her two kids Adrian knew he needed a home to raise his family and that's when he turned to BNT for help. After attending BNT's 8-hour Pre-purchase Education Class Adrian knew he was fully prepared to face the housing market.

BREAKING NEWS: The transformation of Bridgeport's Downtown West neighborhood is underway. It started with the completion of 570 State Street, also known as Gateway Apartments, home to BNT offices and 30 housing units. In 2017 it continues with the completion of the Westgate Apartments on West Avenue. This elegant, five-story, 48-unit mixed-use building with parking and commercial space on the ground floor will also house more than 100 residents, of whom 25% are military veterans. These housing units are so much more than a physical structure, they're an opportunity for a new start, a launching pad to stability. With the focus on veterans, two-term Vietnam era veteran Randy Jackson is one of the many residents calling 515 West Avenue home. After serving his country Jackson found himself displaced from his home and down on his luck until he found BNT.

As if that's not enough, the \$9,000,000 construction contract provided small business enterprises, minority owned businesses, and women owned business with over \$3,000,000 of work and created more than 100 temporary construction jobs.

BNT is linking its efforts to the economic stability for so many, an added benefit to its work in the Park City.

Growing up in a crowded household Elyssa Pacheco knew it was time to move her growing family. The single mother was referred to BNT's Empowerment Resource Academy (ERA) for the Rental Counseling and Education Program where she learned the ins and outs of renting. Once Elyssa completed the program, she was able to apply to the newest development, Westgate Apartments. BNT's staff helped Elyssa every step of the way from developing an action plan to determining financial success to completing her housing application. Elyssa is now a resident and is part of BNT's Resident Engagement and Empowerment Program, a program dedicated to helping families and individuals avoid homelessness by ensuring a partnership between tenants and onsite managers. This partnership helps BNT provide residents access to benefits that will improve their quality of life.
